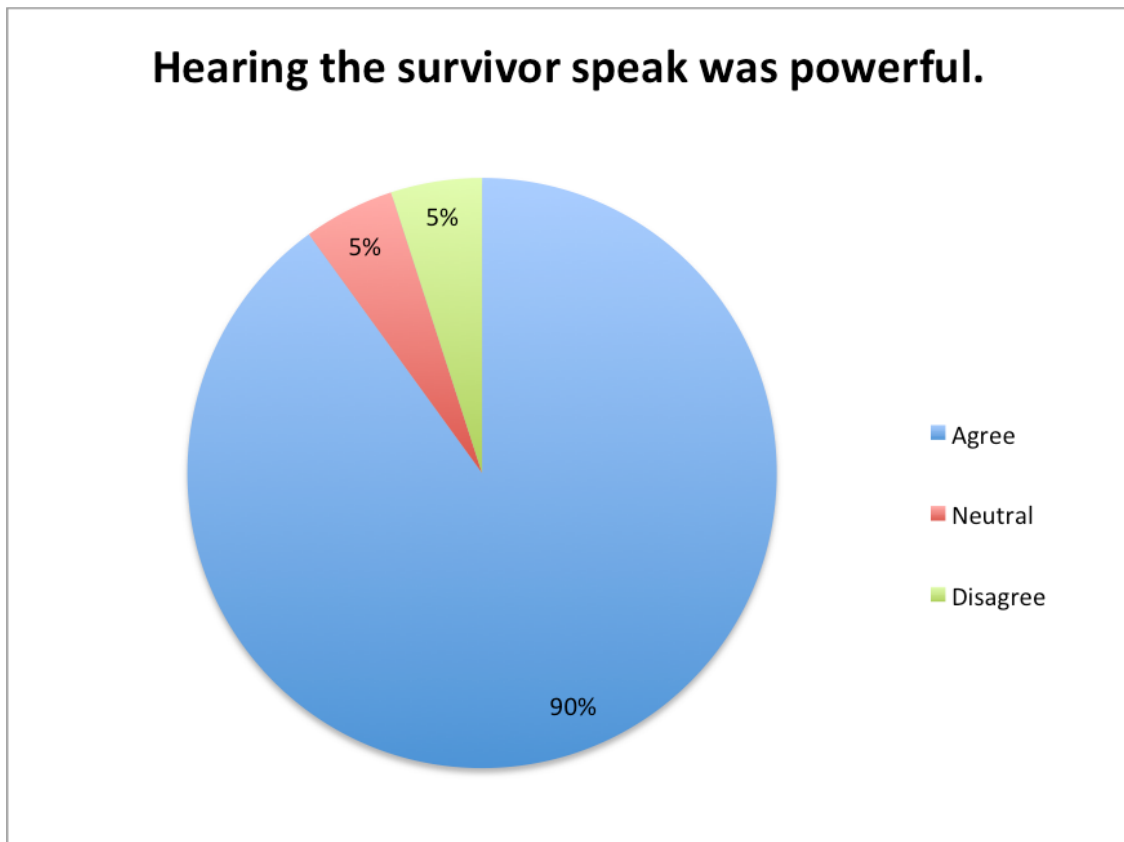

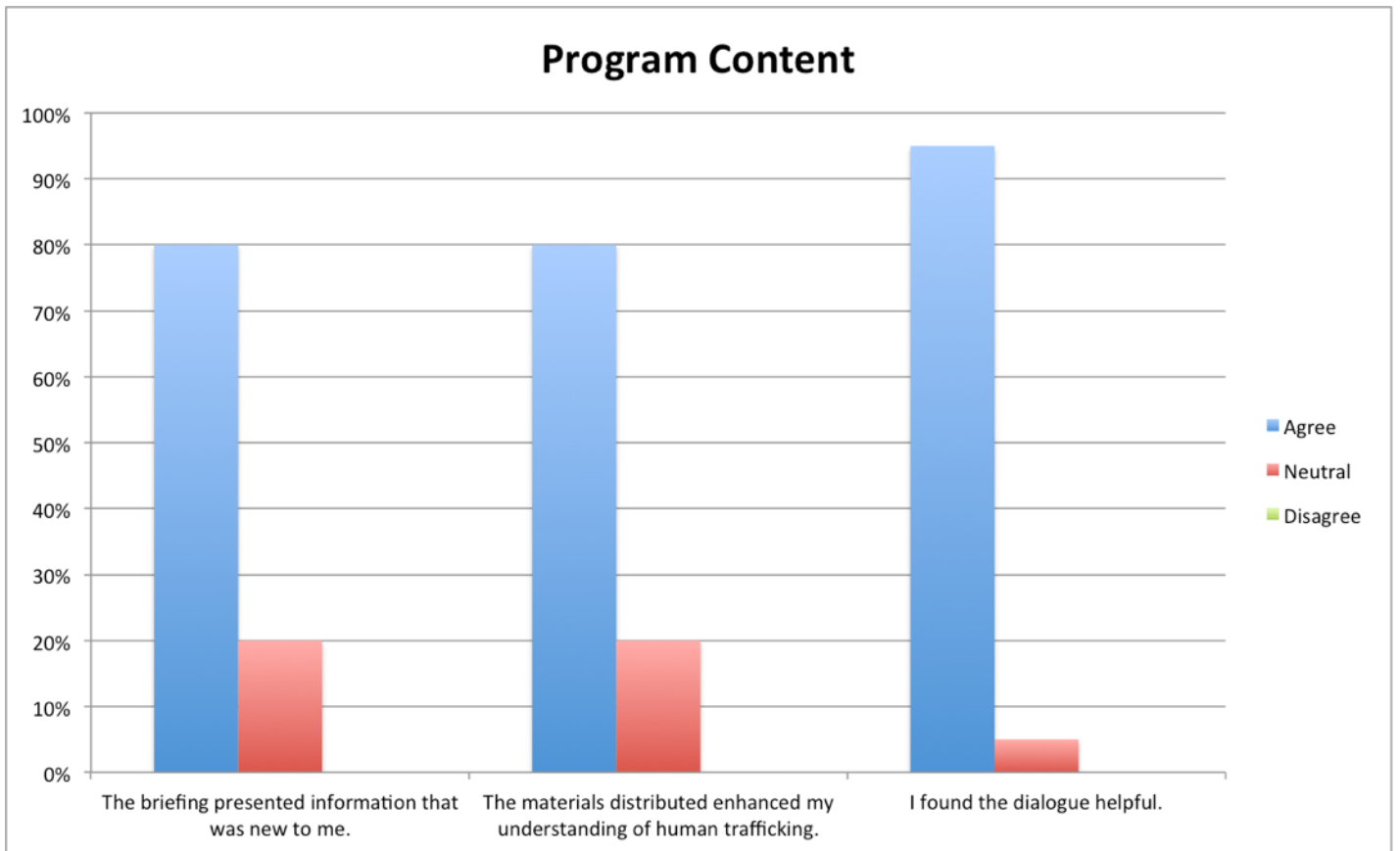

## Coalition Building and Impact

The *Human Trafficking and Transnational/Organized Crime Section for the Office of the Texas Attorney General* has agreed to attend all regional safety director meetings and train carriers with TAT materials.

The *Texas Trucking Association* is partnering with TAT and the Office of the Texas Attorney General to work on a human trafficking bill that will be presented to Texas law makers in the next legislative session.

At the meeting there were **23 representatives of law enforcement** including 10 police departments, 4 Sheriff's Offices, FBI, U.S. Department of Justice, and the Office of the Texas Attorney General.

There were **12 members of the trucking industry** including the Texas Trucking Association President, 1 VP of Safety of a trucking company, 8 general managers from truck stops and 2 trucking instructors from Houston Community College
