


Truckers Against Trafficking / Busing on the Lookout, the Florida Attorney General's Office, the Florida Department of Transportation, Hard Rock/Seminole Gaming, the American Gaming Association, the Florida Public Transportation Association and the Florida Motorcoach Association hosted a virtual briefing designed to increase training and enhance public-private partnerships in Florida to combat human trafficking. This briefing built upon TAT's efforts to connect stakeholders from the bus and casino industries with law enforcement, all with the goal of creating a stronger, more coordinated and more effective anti-trafficking response.
